Pelotonia 2021 was a huge success!

The Anderson Concrete/Buckeye Ready-Mix Pelotonia Team raised more than \$102,000 for cancer research at The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center - Arthur G. James Cancer Center. Over the past seven years, our team raised **\$458,000** and biked over 4,000 miles during Ride Weekend. Thank you to all those who supported, rode, volunteered or donated!

In total, Pelotonia raised over \$19 million in 2021 making the 13-year total over **\$236 million**! 100% of all funds go toward cancer research such as: enhanced treatments and therapies that are loss toxic and more effective, the next generation of research talent through Pelotonia's Fellowship Program that empowers innovators to pursue a career in cancer research, immuno-oncology, and prevention and early diagnosis initiatives to save lives before cancer strikes.

I am proud to call everyone at Anderson Concrete my co-workers, my family, and my friends, and I am most proud of how all of us work together as one team.

Trucks: Poly-Tuff Fenders

Anderson Concrete is scheduled to receive 8 new Western Star 4700's with Con-Tech mixer units in the first quarter of 2022. They will have the same engine and transmission package as the previous year's Western Star units. This is the first time in a while that we have bought all the same chassis and mixer unit combinations in one purchase. "Why?" you may ask... "why are we putting all our eggs in one basket?" Mainly because open slots for new truck builds have been very competitive during the past two years. Luckily, Anderson has great relationships with both the chassis and mixer unit manufacturers in order to keep our fleet new and up to date.

Poly-tuff fenders are a new feature that we are trying out on a couple of the 2022 units. Con-Tech has designed tough lightweight plastic fenders instead of the traditional steel and aluminum fenders. The weight savings between a plastic fender and metal fender is 268 pounds per truck. It will be interesting to see how these fenders perform in our winter and summer climates. Although the poly-tuff technology is new to Anderson, it has been sold by Con-Tech for years with both northern and southern states using the product. Con-Tech is a family owned company in Minnesota that makes most of their materials in the United States.

The Preventative Maintenance Man

Eric Johnson Senior has worked for Anderson since 2014. You know him best as "EJ" and have probably seen him performing an oil change on company cars or driving around the mixer lot filling up diesel exhaust fluid (DEF). "DEF gets topped off every Monday, Wednesday, Friday. These trucks take about 8 gallons of DEF per tank, but the automatics seem to be thirstier than the standard shift trucks. When trucks are running hard in the summer, I can go through 250 gallons of DEF in a week" says EJ. DEF systems are only equipped on Anderson trucks post 2014. It is a fluid that is dosed at a very high temperature which then burns excess soot that is caught in a filter before it is blown out the exhaust. Anderson currently runs 80 mixers equipped with the system, which EJ is responsible for on a weekly basis.

On top of vehicle oil changes and DEF fill ups, EJ also greases multiple trucks on a nightly basis saying: "Each truck gets greased once a month. The grease we use is the best you can get. It lasts long and withstands acid." Grease gets pumped out of a 55 gallon drum and one drum lasts about 6 months. There are multiple grease points on our trucks and EJ goes on to say, "listen for the bacon grease sound and that's when you know old grease is going out and new grease is going in." EJ is an army veteran and worked on light duty trucks while serving his country.

Quality Control: Type IL Cement

Concrete is the most used building material in the world and is second only to water as the most used material regardless of industry. There is no disputing that the process of manufacturing cement contributes to greenhouse gases by producing carbon dioxide and by using fossil fuels. Yet without concrete, there are no bridges, large buildings, hospitals, and the list goes on and on. Many environmentalists accuse cement producers and concrete manufacturers of turning a blind eye to the environment. This is simply not true. Companies such as Anderson Concrete (ACC) have led innovation in the reduction of cement usage. For example, ACC achieves this by using recycled resources as cementitious materials including Fly Ash, Slag and Micro Silica. We have also reduced cement usage by taking advantage of admixture technology and through cutting edge mix design innovation.

In the near future, our industry as a whole will take a huge step forward to protect the environment by switching from Type I and Type II cements to Type IL blended cement. For decades, ACC and other producers around the world have used mainly Type I and Type II cements that allow for up to 5% ground limestone while Type IL blended cement allows up to 15% ground limestone. The additional ground limestone is significant because it will lead to a large reduction of greenhouse gases produced when manufacturing cement. The ground limestone is a material that does not need to be heated during the manufacturing process, therefore reducing the amount of carbon dioxide that is released during production.

This is a very significant change for ACC because our mix designs have been based on the performance of Type I and Type II cements for decades. Our challenges are many and include:

- 1) Leading other concrete producers in the State of Ohio in the testing of Type IL blended cement for approval in ODOT mixes. I am a member of ODOT's technical committee, and we have had ongoing meetings regarding this for over a year.
- 2) Completing ongoing projects where we cannot simply switch materials mid-job.
- 3) Complete testing of Type IL cement for our thousands of mixes and develop a comfort level. ACC has always handled our own analysis of new materials in our onsite lab.
- 4) Potentially handling testing data for all mixes with both types of cements while we get through this transition period.

We started testing mixes with Type IL cement in the beginning of January 2022. Our Quality Control department has been working on these tests six days a week and we are gathering valuable data every single day. While all the details have not been worked out yet, and an enormous amount of testing still needs to be completed, the one certainty is that ACC will lead our market in this switchover and do whatever it takes to be successful!

Lower Olentangy Tunnel

The Lower Olentangy Tunnel (LOT) will connect with the previously constructed Olentangy– Scioto River Augmentation and Relief Sewer Tunnel (OARS) beginning at the Vine Street shaft site and will end on the north side of the OSU Campus. Anderson Concrete supplied concrete to the OARS project for 8 years from 2010-2017. This \$267 million project will construct 17,000

feet of a 12-foot diameter tunnel, which will reduce the overflow from the sewer system into creeks and rivers when major flooding occurs. This project will be constructed by Granite Construction along with several subcontractors including George J. Igel, Keller Construction, Goettle Construction, Bowen Engineering and NorthStar Contracting. Construction of the tunnel has already begun and is expected to conclude in December 2026.

OSU Wexner Medical Tower with The Walsh Group

Fun facts about the new OSU Wexner Medical Tower:

In January 2021, the new OSU Wexner inpatient hospital reached a major milestone. Anderson Concrete poured concrete on the 22nd story of the north and south elevator cores, making it the tallest building on the Ohio State campus. Once complete, there will be 26 full levels, with some smaller levels at the top reaching up to 32 stories.

The estimated yardage of this entire project is 100,000 yards. As of the end of January, we have poured 47,566 yards. We produced 7,156 yards of 12,000 psi concrete, which has never been done at Anderson Concrete, and 5,022 yards of 10,000 psi concrete. The 12,000 psi concrete work has been completed, so the remaining core walls will be 10,000 psi the rest of the way to the top.



Winter Sales Report

Art Marchi, VP of Sales

As we start a new year at Anderson Concrete, Central Ohio is continuing to grow and we will be busy delivering concrete. With continued growth in Columbus, the demand for housing will keep the developers building more residential projects on the High Street Corridor, in the Short North District, the Franklinton area around COSI and the Italian Village District at I-670 and North Fourth Street. New developments are proposed for Old Towne East, which is the area around East Broad Street and Parsons Avenue, and the Whittier Peninsula, which is on the east side of the Scioto River, just south of I-70. Even in German Village, the old Giant Eagle store will become the Schumacker Place mixed use project, where we will be suppling concrete to Dugan & Meyers.

We still have another 18 months of concrete deliveries to make for The Walsh Group on the OSU Wexner Medical Tower (pictures on page 12) and about 4 months left before we finish the Dodd Parking Garage with Dugan & Meyers. Many of the other projects at OSU with Baker Concrete, Igel & Co., Thompson Concrete and Newcomer Concrete will wrap up by summer, but there are several other projects in the bidding stages.

Last fall, we started delivering concrete to the Lower Olentangy Tunnel (LOT) for Granite Construction, who is the construction manager. That project will keep us busy for many years and there will be multiple contractors that we will be servicing. (See article on page 11)

Soon, we will be back at Crew Stadium delivering concrete to Dugan & Meyers for the Astro Parking Garage, which will provide parking for the proposed office building and residential tower that will start later in 2022.

We have about 6 more months of concrete deliveries to Lithko Contracting at the Children's Hospital Parking Garage. Right next to the garage, we will be starting a project with Messer Construction for the Children's Hospital Surgical Tower.

Anderson Concrete does not do a lot of warehouse work, mainly because the projects are not located in our market area, but that could change this year. We are bidding a lot of warehouse projects in the New Albany area, the Commercial Point Corridor on Route 104 and on South High Street across from Olen's aggregate quarry.

2022 will be another strong year for Anderson Concrete and we are thankful to have the team, equipment and tools in place to help the City of Columbus to continue to grow and thrive.
